**Regarding the permanent non-acceptance of gifts and presents of any kind (No Gift Policy).**

Koh Chang Police Station is committed to developing transparent operations, prioritizing the public interest over personal gain, and avoiding conflicts of interest. In line with the government development policy to achieve the goals set in the master plan under the national strategy, issue (21) Anti-corruption and misconduct (2023-2037) (amended version), which aims for agencies to operate with transparency, without conflict of interest, and all government officials not to accept gifts and presents of any kind in performing their duties (No Gift Policy).

Therefore, in accordance with the intent and the ethical standards of government officials, Koh Chang Police Station. Furthermore, all police officers are prohibited from accepting any gifts or presents of any kind in the performance of their duties (No Gift Policy), both before and after performing their duties, as well as adhering to the announcement of the National Anti-Corruption Commission. Regarding the Guidelines for the Acceptance of Assets or Other Benefits in a Moral and Ethical Manner by Government Officials, B.E. 2563 (2020), this aims to collectively build an organizational culture and values of integrity in work performance, reject patronage, prevent unfair conduct in the performance of duties, and avoid conflicts of interest, while simultaneously building public trust in the performance of duties with good governance.
